Covid - Here we are once again, writing about Covid and how to stay safe. A few reminders that would be helpful to our community. If you do test positive, please let me know immediately. I can be in touch with other residents who may have been exposed and advise them as to the latest CDC protocols. If you have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for Covid, please test yourself for Covid with a rapid test five days after exposure and wear a mask when around other people for 10 days after exposure. The Covid variant is very contagious. Rapid tests are covered by insurance and can be picked up at your local pharmacy.

A second booster is highly recommended for people over 60. As a safety measure, please consider wearing a mask when in close contact with other people or in large groups.
