Cord-mate Testing - For those residents who use our cord-mate system; We will begin testing them next week at Brush Hill. You will receive a phone call letting you know when we will perform the test on your cord-mate. We will be checking your bracelet or necklace that you use with the cord-mate system.

Exterior Window Washing is being scheduled for the week of June 27th. We will let you know the exact date!

Information on Irrigation for Villa Residents - Fifty zones are running to irrigate the Blue Hill campus. Each zone has 25 to 30 individual heads. Our focus is the front of the Villas and front of Foster and Depoyan buildings. Ideally every lawn would be watered overnight but the number of zones we have do not allow us to schedule only overnight watering. If you see an irrigation head that is directed the wrong way, give us a call and we can send someone to adjust it.



Residents' Association Corner

As stated in the Residents' Association Bylaws one mission of the Association is to "represent the interest of Residents to MFHC," and "to work with Residents and MFHC to maintain a residential community of the highest possible quality." In addition to other duties it is also stated, "the President shall serve as an ex officio voting member of the Board of Directors of MFHC." On June 8th I submitted a vote to the Board of Directors "in absentia" as follows:

Concerning the financial information, on behalf of myself and representing the residents I vote "no" on the proposed 9% monthly increase.

This would represent a 14% increase in the past two years. Under the current economic situation, I know that some residents are feeling financial anxiety and this increase will be stressful to some and painful to some.

The Board vote was 9-1.

Earlier this week Pat Kelleher, Vice President, and Irene Brannelly, Treasurer, and I met with Treasurer Phillip Mathews of the MFHC Board, along with Peggy Peyton and Deborah Felton. More information was presented in addition to the letter we all just received from President Chris Heavey. The Board of Directors is working toward operating income covering operating expenses. In addition, the inflation rate is high and unpredictable. Along with your copy of *Week at Fuller*, there will be additional budget information from our management for your attention.




