Meet Wanjiku (our Executive Director), Mercy (our Nairobi, Kenya, staff person) and Irene (a GTL graduate from Tanzania) in person! Also see slides and film clips of our girls and their schools. The onehour program will be followed by light refreshments. See you there!

We especially want to acknowledge the 33 Fuller Village residents who together are supporting 14 girls in secondary school in 2022! What wonderful generosity! We celebrate you! Over the 25 years, more than 1,800 girls have graduated from secondary school thanks to GTL, and this year we are supporting over 340 girls, including over 100 new students.

Growth Through Learning (GTL) provides full secondary education scholarships for exceptional young women in Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania who would otherwise be unable to afford education beyond primary school. GTL and other efforts to support girls' education are critically important. Although the value of girls' education is well known, few girls in East Africa attend high school and even fewer graduate.
