Shows like Kiss Me, Kate, Guys and Dolls, and My Fair Lady offered sophisticated literary adaptations, and The Ed Sullivan Show brought a television spotlight to Broadway. With the death of Oscar Hammerstien II in 1960 after The Sound of Music, the curtain lowered on a golden age.

Once you download the app, follow these steps to locate our machines:

- 1) Go to your Settings (The three white lines in the top left corner)
- 2) Go to Account
- 3) Press Connections
- 4) Press Browse Connections
- 5) Enter 13991372
- 6) It will bring up "Residents (Community Charging) Fuller Village select it
- 7) Check that you agree to the terms and conditions.
- 8) Press Submit Requests
- 9) You will receive an email saying that you are now able to charge at our machine

It is our belief that the "Cordmate" system that works with in-unit Pull Cord technology does not always function properly. Given the aging nature of the Cordmate technology, we have decided to discontinue the program as of November 1st.

Any deposit paid for the bracelet or necklace will be deposited back into your account by November 1. The Cordmates will be removed from units starting on November 1<sup>st</sup>. A Fuller Village staff person will be picking up the equipment. While Fuller Village does not endorse a particular company, here are a few companies you may want to consider:

The watch uses a feature called "fall-prevention" or "Emergency SOS" that will detect if you have fallen. When you make a call with Emergency SOS, your Apple Watch automatically calls local emergency services and shares your location with them.

Please review this information and if necessary, go over it with a friend or family member to decide which system is right for you. Enrollment with any of these services will be direct with the company and not through Fuller Village.


