World AIDS Day Speaker: Dr. Gary Bailey at 7 pm (Brush Hill Function Room)

Every year on December 1st, the world unites to commemorate World AIDS Day, a reminder of the global struggle to end HIV-related stigma, an opportunity to honor those we have lost, and a rallying cry to continue working toward a day when HIV is no longer a public health threat. The Quilt is a source of remembrance, healing and hope.
